Original Call:

Ofc Edwards was at the residence to arrest Cephas Parham for two confirmed outstanding felony warrants.

Suspect Actions:

Parham immediately fled from officers upon sight. Parham refused to stop for orders from both Ofc Edwards and Ofc Gorman. Parham jumped a fence, climbed a rock wall and started to run through a large juniper patch when he was contacted by K9 Maximus. Parham fought K9 Maximus off by kicking and punching him and threw him off the rock wall and into a garage wall. K9 Maximus was able to get up, catch and contact Parham again. Parham continued to fight K9 Maximus by kicking, kneeing, punching and choking him. It took several officers to stop him from fighting the dog and place him in custody.

Officer Safety Concerns/ Why was Canine used:

Parham had two confirmed outstanding felony warrants for Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle. Parham was also listed on the 'Repeat Offender Program', Spokane's list of the current top 25 most active criminals, listing burglary as his crimes. Parham had successfully fled from officers several times in recent months, including jumping out of a multi story window and escaping a Police K9. Parham had proven hard to catch and the use of a K9 was the safest and highest chance of a successful capture. Parham was well known for breaking into residences. Due to time of day, it was likely he would break into an occupied residence in an attempt to evade arrest. It was unknown if Parham was armed but burglars typically carry some type of personal protection.

INJURY DESCRIPTION:

Injury:

Injuries consisted of approx 5 punctures and rakes on his right ankle, 4 rakes on his left elbow, 2 rakes on his ring finger on the left hand, one puncture on his left shin and several rakes and punctures on the front and back of his left knee.

It should be noted these are not typical injuries of a K9 contact. These injuries were more severe due to Parham's actions. By ripping the contacted area out of K9 Max's mouth he caused rakes and punctures not typically present. By fighting with K9 Max he caused several contact sites instead of the typical one contact site with minimal injury.

Parham would have gotten away for a third time without the use of K9.

SUPERVISORY COMMENTS:

K-9 Supervisor Comments:

On 102510 Ofc. Gorman responded to assist with a felony warrant arrest (Parham). The suspect had an extensive criminal history and had successfully fled from Officers before. Officer Gorman took a perimeter position while Officers attempted to contact the suspect at the front of his residence. Officers identified themselves to the suspect as he walked away from his residence. The suspect immediately fled on foot. Officer Gorman made a verbal announcement prior to sending K-9 Max to apprehend the suspect. The suspect made no attempt to stop or comply. Ofc. Gorman deployed K-9 Max in order to apprehend the actively resisting suspect. K-9 Max caught up to and contacted the suspect in a backyard. The suspect immediately started fighting with K-9 Max to include throwing K-9 Max off a three foot wall and into a garage wall. K-9 Max chased after and caught the suspect again as he was attempting to flee through some bushes. The suspect again fought with K-9 Max to include hitting him in the head and choking him. The suspect continued to struggle with the Officers as they pulled him off of K-9 Max. The suspect was eventually taken into custody with the assistance of several Officers. K-9 Max immediately released upon command. The suspect had been contacted on several different areas of his body which is consistent with a suspect that fights with the K-9's. The suspect had been contacted on his right ankle, left elbow, left hand, left shin, and left knee. Several of the injuries were self inflicted by forcing the K-9 off of the contact. The utilization of the K-9 in this situation was critical in reducing the danger to the Officers had they tried to apprehend the suspect on their own. The use and deployment of K-9 Max was within Graham vs. Conner and SPD policy. K-9 Max suffered a bleeding injury to his mouth (and probably other non-visible injuries) and the detectives office is filing charges for Harming a Police Dog. Sgt. T. D. Teigen #329

Myself, Officer Wheeler and McCollough have actively been looking for Parham. Parham has numerous felony "no bail" warrants for his arrest.

Parham also consistently flees from law enforcement when being contacted. It should be noted that SPD detectives had located Parham about 3 weeks ago, Parham had escaped by jumping from a 3rd story apartment window.

Several weeks ago I learned from Officer McCollough that Parham was driving a white 4-door vehicle bearing Idaho plates.

Last Tuesday 10/19/10 I received anonymous information that Parham might be frequenting [REDACTED] N. Cannon. On that day I did not make contact [REDACTED] as it did not appear anyone was home.

Tonight, 10/25/10, I checked the residence at [REDACTED] N. Cannon and saw a white Toyota Camry bearing ID/K458980 parked in front of the residence. I also saw Aiken's Jeep parked in the driveway.

There was also a blue Honda Civic bearing WA/499ZDU parked on the street in front of the Camry.

I set up surveillance to the south of the location. Officer Wheeler arrived in the area to assist, please read his additional.

After about 15 minutes I observed a male open the driver's door to the Camry. I saw the male shut the door and proceed back to the residence carrying several items that appeared to be backpacks.

About 5 minutes later I observed the Honda leave traveling south on Cannon. I asked Officer Wheeler to contact the occupant of that vehicle.

Moments later, Wheeler advised that the Honda was occupied by Angelic Cook. Based on leads and information obtained, Cook and Parham are in a dating relationship.

At that time I requested more units to include a police K9 officer. Officer's Gorman and Hamilton arrived with their respective k9's.

Officer Gorman, Matthews and myself positioned ourselves in the front of the residence. Lt. Walker and Officer Hamilton covered the alley.

After several minutes I saw the front door open, Parham was standing just inside the residence conversing with someone. Parham then walked out and proceeded towards the driveway.

I identified myself and Parham made an abrupt movement like he was going to retreat to the front door again. He then ran north towards the driveway and Aiken's Jeep, where Gorman and his k9 were positioned.

I heard Officer Gorman giving Parham clear commands to stop. Please read Gorman's additional.

Parham had made it over a fence and was in some juniper shrubs, I could hear Gorman telling Parham to let go of the dog.

I climbed over the fence and up into the juniper shrubs, the shrubs were very thick and I could see Gorman struggling with Parham. I approached and it appeared Parham was trying to choke the k9.

Officer Gorman was clearly telling Parham to place his hands behind his back and to quit resisting. Parham continued to fight with the k9.

The shrubs were on top of a rock wall that was approximately 3 to 4 feet high and 2 to 3 feet from the side of the residence. During the struggle Parham fell off the wall and onto the ground next to the residence. I tried for about 1 to 1 1/2 minutes taking control off his right arm and trying to get it behind his back; Parham fist was clenched and he was still resisting and trying to pull away from the k9. When I was able to get his right arm behind his back, Parham put his left arm behind his back. I was able to secure Parham with my handcuffs.

Parham was escorted to the front yard, medics were summoned to check Parham prior to transporting him to Deaconess ER to treat his injuries. Parham vital signs were normal.

I contacted Aiken at the front door [REDACTED] Aiken was reluctant to answer the door. I asked Aiken if he would produce the backpack's (or items) I had seen the male remove from the vehicle and walk into the house with. Aiken retrieved a computer bag and backpack. Aiken said the bags did not belong to him nor there contents and affirmed I could look in them.

Nothing of evidentiary value were located in the packs; only a replica Beretta air soft gun was located in the computer bag in a tan holster.

I transported Parham to Deaconess ER where his injuries were treated. At the conclusion of being treated, I transported him to jail where he was booked on warrants and for resisting arrest citation #N023951.

On 102510 at approx 2035hrs I responded to [REDACTED] N Cannon to assist other officers with a possible warrant arrest. Ofc Edwards was at the residence to arrest Cephas Parham.

I decided to deploy SPD K9 Maximus for the following reasons;

Parham had two confirmed outstanding felony warrants for Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle. Parham was also listed on the 'Repeat Offender Program', Spokane's list of the current top 25 most active criminals, listing burglary as his crimes. Parham had successfully fled from officers several times in recent months, including jumping out of a multi story window and escaping a Police K9. Parham had proven hard to catch and the use of a K9 was the safest and highest chance of a successful capture. Parham was well known for breaking into residences. Due to time of day, it was likely he would break into an occupied residence in an attempt to evade arrest. It was unknown if Parham was armed but burglars typically carry some type of personal protection.

I contacted Ofc Edwards in front of the residence. He advised he developed information Parham was inside. Ofc Edwards knows and can recognize Parham. I took up a position on the northeast corner of the house, behind a parked vehicle on the driveway. Ofc Edwards was in the front yard. After several minutes the front door opened. Ofc Edwards communicated to me that the male exiting the residence was Parham. Parham stood in the doorway for approx one minute then exited. He walked down a sidewalk next to the house for approx 10 feet towards me then Ofc Edwards identified himself and ordered him to stop.

Immediately Parham sprinted towards me in an attempt to flee from Ofc Edwards and ran around the opposite side of the vehicle I was behind. I announced "Spokane Police! Stop or I'll release the dog!" Parham made no attempt to stop running and jumped a 4' picket fence that separated the front and back yard very quickly. It was obvious Parham was athletic and very quick. I released K9 Max and gave him the command to contact. K9 Max had 'target lock' on Parham and started to pursue him.

Parham climbed up a 3 foot block wall and started to run into a very thick stand of juniper bushes. The bushes were approx 2.5-3 feet tall and had grown together. K9 Max caught Parham approx 3 feet into the bushes. I saw K9 Max contact Parham's right ankle. Parham made no noise and started kicking at K9 Max with his other foot. Parham reached down and grabbed K9 Max's

chain collar and held him as he ripped his ankle out of his mouth. Parham held onto Max and threw him backwards off the 3' block wall and into the garage wall. K9 Max struck the wall and landed on his back on a pile of loose pipes and misc debris.

Parham took off running n/w again through the bushes. K9 Max got up and started to pursue Parham again. K9 Max caught him in the middle of the bushes, approx even with the back of the house. I was running through the bushes to catch up so I didn't see exactly how K9 Max contacted Parham, but I did see that he had contacted his left elbow. I observed Parham still didn't say anything and was prying K9 Max's mouth off his elbow. He was able to pull his elbow free by violently pulling it out and hitting K9 Max in the face with his other hand.

When he turned to run K9 Max contacted him on his left knee. Parham fell and started to yell. When they fell into the bushes I couldn't see them until I got closer. K9 Max had contacted his left knee. Parham was sitting on his butt facing K9 Max. Parham had his left hand on K9 Max's collar and was pulling it forward and had his thumb in K9 Max's lip as if trying to pry his mouth off. His right arm was around K9 Max's neck and throat as if he was choking him. I also observed Parham knee K9 Max in his side with his right knee.

It was obvious Parham was fighting the dog and was not willing to give up. I yelled, 'Stop fighting the dog! Let go and let me see your hands! Let the dog go!' Parham briefly looked at me but continued to fight with K9 Max. I approached behind Parham who was still sitting as he fought with K9 Max. I used a level 1 LVNR and pulled Parham's upper torso back and away from K9 Max. It took a considerable amount of effort but I was able to pull Parham off K9 Max. Once I was able to straighten him out I pulled him out of the bushes and into the back yard, on the n/w corner of the garage. Parham was attempting to pull my arm off his neck and was still pulling on K9 Max's collar with his left hand.

After several commands Parham released K9 Max and my arm. By this time several other officers were there and we attempted to place Parham into prone cuffing position. Parham still resisted and we ended up applying handcuffs to him as he was still in the seated position. We had to wrestle his arms behind his back as he was not cooperative and refused to put his hands behind his back. As other officers applied handcuffs I gave K9 Max the command to release and he did to immediately.

Medics responded and evaluated Parham due to the LVNR. They advised he was fine and he was transported to Deaconess for treatment/evaluation of the contact. I responded as well. Upon arrival I read Parham his constitutional rights, which advised he understood but did not waive. He refused to answer questions.

I observed the injuries which consisted of approx 5 punctures and rakes on his right ankle, 4 rakes on his left elbow, 2 rakes on his ring finger on the left hand, one puncture on his left shin and



On 102510 at approx. 2007 hours, I assisted Ofc. Edwards at [REDACTED] N. Cannon. Ofc. Edwards and I had been looking for a wanted subject, Cephias Parham, during our previous work week. Ofc. Edwards got information that Cephias and his girlfriend, Angelic Cook, may be staying at [REDACTED] N. Cannon.

Ofc. Edwards advised me there were two vehicles parked in front of the location. Ofc. Edwards advised me there was a blue Honda Civic leaving the location and driving towards my location. Ofc. Edwards also advised me the RO had a warrant for their arrest and to stop the vehicle. I stopped the vehicle near Oak and Lacrosse.

I contacted the female driver and asked what her name was [REDACTED]. The female said her name was Angelic Cook [REDACTED]. I immediately recognized Cook's name as the girlfriend of Cephias Parham. Ofc. Edwards had previously contacted Cook's parents and advised them of who their daughter was dating and what he was wanted for. Ofc. McCollough also contacted Cook at her parents home and Cook said she did not know where Cephias was at. Ofc. McCollough later found out Cook was lying and Cephias was hiding in the basement.

Cook had on several occasions lied to law enforcement about Parham's location so he could not be apprehended. We also were getting information from sources that Cook was driving Parham around from different locations hiding him from law enforcement.

I told Cook to stay in the car. I then advised Ofc. Edwards to immediately get a perimeter around the house because I had Angelic in the vehicle and knew Parham would be in the house. I then went back and had Angelic step out of the vehicle. I advised Angelic that if she knew Cephias Parham was in the house, it was now time to cooperate. Angelic denied that Cephias was in the house. Angelic said after her parents told her about his warrants, she stopped hanging around him. I asked

Angelica if she left from the house or garage at [REDACTED] N. Cannon. Angelica said she left from the house.

I asked her who was in the house when she left. Angelica said there were two males, Kyle and Dave. I advised Ofc. Edwards that Angelica was denying that Cephas was in the home. Moments later while talking to Angelica, I heard Ofc. Edwards advise Radio they had a male running NW. After confirming the male in custody was Cephas Parham, I advised Angelica to get in my patrol car so I could transport her back to the address. Once I arrived at the address, I asked Lt. Walker and Ofc. Edwards if we should arrest Cook for Rendering Criminal Assistance 2nd degree. Lt. Walker and Ofc. Edwards both confirmed we needed to arrest Angelica. I had Angelica step out of my patrol car. I advised her she was under arrest for 2nd degree Rendering Criminal Assistance. I handcuffed (dl) and searched her.

I transported and booked Angelica into the Spokane County Jail for the aforementioned charge.
